ACCOMMODATIONS

The Youth With A Mission San Antonio Del Mar campus is the ministry's flagship property. It overlooks the Pacific Ocean in Baja California, Mexico. This campus is located 20 minutes south of the U.S. border and is in between Tijuana and Rosarito.

The San Antonio Del Mar campus is home to several University of the Nations training schools, as well as a variety of ministries including Homes of Hope. This campus also hosts international and local conferences throughout the year. There are currently 200 beds, but the campus is being developed to host over 800.

The YWAM facility is a totally self-contained set of buildings where we will all eat, sleep and meet. It is a secure, guarded, multi-million dollar facility that has been designed and built specifically to house, feed and host home building groups

TRAVEL

We will be flying domestically from Atlanta to San Diego.

Once arriving in San Diego, Youth With A Mission/Homes of Hope, an international missions organization that specializes in house builds, will pick us up at the airport and transport us to their local location in San Antonio Del Mar, Mexico. We will be spending four nights at their home base location in Mexico and travel daily to our work location approximately one hour from our lodging.

The Homes of Hope organization will provide all transportation to/from San Diego to Mexico and during our stay in Mexico as well.

We will rent private vehicles or use public transportation for our free day in San Diego.

PERSONAL SAFETY

A word about personal safety in Mexico. We always travel in groups and the YWAM staff has radios and cell phones at all times. They only build in "safe" areas and are warmly welcomed by all of the neighbors in the community.

YWAM has built over 5,000 homes in the Tijuana and Ensenada area in the past 25 years while hosting over 100,000 "builders" without any personal safety incident. We stay in a guarded campus of buildings in a safe area.

HOMES OF HOPE OPERATIONAL PRECAUTIONS

- 1. Group based, not individual based: Everything we do is done as a group. We travel and work in groups. At no time are people sent alone to do anything in Mexico.
- 2. Staff participation: Each group has one or more YWAM staff members with them at all times. We are a full-service missions group and provide general setup and supervision of all our teams and groups. We presently have a staff of more than 180 people who work to serve the visiting groups.
- 3. Communications: YWAM field staff has cell phones so we can have ongoing communications as needed while working in Mexico.
- 4. Local Knowledge: YWAM and its visiting teams do not work independently of the communities in which we serve. Any areas, which may be possibly unsafe, are avoided. We work together with local pastors and community leaders who know their communities well. Our teams are very well received, and we have even won a variety of awards from the Mayors of both Tijuana and Ensenada in appreciation of our work with the poor.
- 5. Hours of Operation: Our work takes place primarily in daylight hours. Normally all our activities are completed with people back in their rooms by 10pm. We also employ night watchmen at both our Tijuana and Ensenada Centers.

HEALTH SAFETY

During the fall of 2020 we are starting to host a few smaller Homes of Hope teams while implementing our new Covid-19 guidelines for future Homes of Hope builds. To create these guidelines, we are reviewing information from the government of Baja California, Mexico, the U.S. foreign and domestic travel recommendations and state of California guidelines. Presently U.S. citizens can cross freely in and out of Mexico with no visa required when traveling by car into Baja California, Mexico.

We are committed to:

- Relevant and timely communication to all our teams, students and staff concerning any important changes and updates related to the Coronavirus and how it impacts the ministry of San Diego/Baja.
- We are regularly reviewing the updates and guidelines of the Center for Disease Control (CDC) in the United States and the Mexican government regulations.
- We are taking all the necessary practical steps and ongoing precautions to keep all our facilities clean and healthy for all of our students, participating and staff.

- 1. Participant Application
- 2. Spiritual Inventory Sheet
- 3. Liability Release Form
- 4. Copy of Government ID (Passport for International)
- 5. Copy of Health Insurance Card
- 6. List of all Vaccinations for medical purposes in case of an emergency.
- 7. Character Reference Form
- 8. Affidavit of temporary guardianship (if you are younger than 18 years old)
- 9. Permission to administer meds while on trip
- 10. Background Check for those over the age of 18 if minors are attending the trip

Step 1:

Complete a Participate Application.

You will receive a confirmation after your application has been approved.

Step 2:

Pay your deposit

Submit your Deposit.

Receipt of your deposit tentatively holds your spot pending review and approval of application. Space is often limited and acceptance is based on a first come, first serve basis. Deposits are NON-REFUNDABLE as they block off a spot for you and are used to forward fund costs associated with the trip (i.e. hotel, transportation, etc.) Make checks and/or money orders payable to The Project 143 Foundation. Please do not pay your deposit until AFTER your application is approved.
